#### II. Five Points of Calvinism

- Why is it necessary for Christ to be both fully man and fully God?
  - Fully God- John 1:1-14, John 20:28, Philippians 2:9-11, Colossians 1:19, Isaiah 9:6
  - Fully human- Galatians 4:4, Philippians 2:5-11, 1 Corinthians 15:21
- How is Christ our prophet, priest, and king?
  - Prophet- Duet. 18:18, Is. 61:1-3, Luke 7:16
  - Priest- Hebrews 3:1, 4:14, 7:25, Mark 10:45
  - King- Isaiah 9:1-7, Luke 1:32-33, Matthew 28:18
- What is meant by the active and passive obedience of Christ?
  - Active obedience- He fulfilled the law perfectly. Galatians 4:4
  - Passive obedience- He willingly took on the curse of the law for our sake. Philippians 2:8
- What is meant by the atonement?
  - Christ paid the penalty for our sin, thereby satisfying God's righteous wrath. Is. 53, Col. 1:19-20
- What is meant by justification?
  - WCF 11. *Justification is an act of God's free grace, wherein he pardons all our sins, and accepts us as righteous in his sight, only for the righteousness of Christ imputed to us, and received by faith alone.* WSC  
*To be justified does not mean that an ungodly man is made righteous, but that he is pronounced righteous in a forensic manner.* -Melancthon
  - Key texts- Luke 18:9-14, Romans 3:21-26, Romans 8:1, 1 Corinthians 1:30, 31, 2 Corinthians 5:21, Galatians 2:15-16, Galatians 3:8-9
- What is meant by adoption?
  - WCF 12. *Adoption is an act of God's grace whereby we are received into the number and have a right to all the privileges of the sons of God.*
  - Key texts- Ephesians 1:3-7, Romans 8:29, Galatians 4:1-7, 1 John 3:1, 2
- What is meant by sanctification?
  - WCF 13. *Sanctification is a work of God's free grace, whereby we are renewed in the whole man after the image of God, and enabled more and more to die unto sin, and live unto righteousness. God's working in us is not suspended because we work, nor our working suspended because God works. Neither is the relation strictly one of cooperation as if God did his part and we did ours...God works in us and we also work. But the relation is that because God works, we work.* -John Murray

  - WCF 16. Good works serve as the fruit or evidence of salvation.
  - Matthew 7:17, Hebrews 11:6.
